

We showcase concrete alternatives deployed by cities, we advocate to change political and economic governance at all levels and we foster a wide cultural change leading to a future-proofed society.




# **GOVERNANCE AND FUNDING**

# Agile & horizontal


The organisation constitution changes every time we identify a need and collectively agree on a solution.
